- All districts have a constitution and variations exist for each district.
- The OPA Bylaws were updated in 2016 to reflect the incoming Not-For-Profit
 Corporations Act. We will be engaging with Districts in the future to review their constitutions to ensure alignment with the updated Bylaws.

[NAME] DISTRICT CONSTITUTION

I NAME

The name of this District shall be the "____ District of the Ontario Physiotherapy Association".

- II OBJECT
- III BOUNDARIES
- IV MEMBERSHIP
 - The membership shall consist of all members of the OPA residing in the
 District, and those who have been accepted for membership in the District
 from another District or Branch in accordance with the related policies of the
 OPA. (Must reside or work in the District)
 - If membership in the District falls below ___ members, the District shall automatically be dissolved.
 - Voting privileges for all members shall comply with the related Bylaw of OPA.

V FEES

Members shall not be required to pay fees over and above the membership fees of CPA and OPA.

DISTRICT COURSE TOOLKIT

As per OPA policy, an OPA district course is when <u>ALL</u> of the following are true:

- A. The district is involved in the organizing of the course
- B. All or a portion of the revenue goes to the district
- C. Member fees are discounted by at least 20% from non-member fees



REGISTRATION & ZOOM

You are hosting a district course. Now what?

- Recommendation: All district courses, webinars and events for which there is registration run through OPA's website
- Fee to attend? (members and/or non-members)
 Registration MUST go through the store (for HST reasons)
- Online course? Set up your Zoom event BEFORE
 registration so registrants automatically get link to attend

FINANCIAL INFORMATION



Financial Information - General Information

- Districts are the regional representation of the Association in Ontario
- All funds held by Districts are funds of the OPA
- Districts keep records of income and expenditures and keep receipts and banking records for five years
- Districts complete an annual report of their financial activity to submit to the Corporate Manager (Diane)
- Details can be found in policy 04-015 District Financials





Financial Information – District Allotments and Support

- Districts receive an allotment of funds to support their activities annually based on the number of members in your District. Funds range from \$350 to \$600
- Districts can access additional support through a written request to the CEO for Board approval. Funds are dependent on availability and on a first come basis
- In addition Districts can hold events including educational offerings to help raise funds
- More details can be found in Policy 04-013-B District Allotments and Support



Financial Information - Banking

- Each District will establish a banking account in the name of '(name of District) District of the Ontario Physiotherapy Association' and include two signing officers for the account.
- Districts will bank at the Royal Bank the bank used by the OPA to ease access should any issues arise with contacting signing officers.
- All banking information including bank transit number, account number(s), type of account and the names and contact information for signing officers will be shared with the OPA Corporate Manager and if any changes Districts will update the Corporate Manager immediately.






